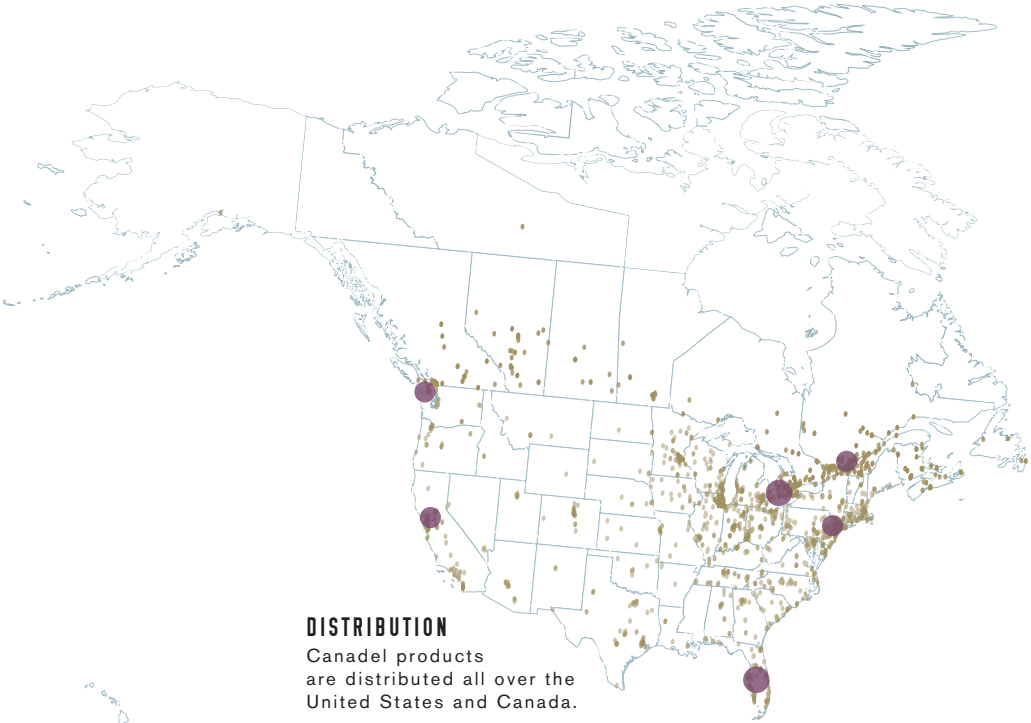

Canadel products are distributed all over the United States and Canada.

Like many family businesses, the dining-room furniture manufacturer grew out of modest beginnings. Before founding Canadel, Guy Deveault, now CEO, worked in his father's furniture factory. "I worked there every summer while I was at school," he recalls. "I did a bit of everything, starting in the shop and working my way up to foreman." In 1982, after their university studies, Guy and his brother Michel (today Canadel's president) joined their father.


Since 1982, the transformation of the furniture industry has been revolutionary, from the way furniture is made to outsourcing and distribution to the shopping habits of customers. The Deveaults' reputation for honesty and integrity in business dealings has stood them in good stead every step of the way.

Their values have never changed, and in fact they believe in business integrity more firmly than ever. "We often close deals with no more than a handshake, the good old-fashioned way," says Guy Deveault. "We really enjoy our work and that comes across in our dealings with partners, suppliers, and clients. We've drawn inspiration from those we've worked with from day one."

Michel and Guy Deveault learned all about job satisfaction from their father and have been able to pass it on to their own children, who also work for Canadel. Guy's daughter, Marie-Christine, is now responsible for marketing and design coordination, and she works closely with her cousin and product development manager, Jean-Philippe. Like her father and uncle, Marie-Christine can't get over the way the company's

700 employees put their hearts into their work every day—or the enjoyment they get out of it. "Everyone is so passionate about quality, whether they work in the factory or the office. Everything runs like clockwork."

Like any thriving company, Canadel continues to grow and innovate, with three new collections introduced in the last year and its high-tech plant—equipped with cutting-edge modern machinery—always expanding. It also continues to value the human connection, with a dedicated and loyal workforce, many of whom have been with the company for more than 20 years.

The Deveault family tree is healthy and strong, as is the company the family has so carefully built, protected, and nurtured.

QUALITY, TIME AFTER TIME

Attention to detail, handcrafted workmanship, and made-to-measure furniture all set Canadel apart from the competition. Here's how.

We couldn't be further from mass production. Each and every item of Canadel furniture—for the Gourmet, Loft, Canadel, Downtown, Champlain and East Side collections—is handmade. Every detail is given the lavish attention it deserves, from wood stain or a cushion's last seam to leg design and ornate woodwork. Each production stage is carefully inspected to ensure that everything produced meets the high quality standards that have made Canadel's reputation for over 30 years now. The company even has its own wood-processing facility to ensure the most consistent quality. "It takes two to eight months to come up with a new product," explains sales manager Denis Charest. "From having an idea for the prototype right through

to production, everything is studied and tested to make sure the wood stays in place and that the piece of furniture will keep its good looks for the rest of its long life. It's easy to forget, but wood is alive, after all!"

"This might look like a simple chair," CEO Guy Deveau continues, "but there's a tree inside and hours of design and manual labor that go into it." That's clear for all to see when you visit Canadel's 650,000+ sq. ft. facilities and are walked through the various stages that transform a birch board into a high-end table or a comfy chair. "Every dining-room table is custom-built, made to measure for the client. No two products are the same on this production line."

First off, depending on the collection, any knots in the wood must be filled in to give the furniture a longer life. It has to be done quickly—the resin dries in a flash—and carefully, too: the boards need to be reinforced, without detracting from their natural appearance.

The boards are sanded next, then distressed, giving the wood a natural, aged look. It takes a deft artisan to imitate the ravages of time without damaging the wood... in other words, don't try this at home! In fact, Canadel employees have come up with their own distressing tools, a manufacturing secret that gives certain Canadel products their unique appearance. Tables, chairs, and stools are then stained, also by hand. The specialists look like painters with their palettes, ensuring a uniform stain for every dining-room set, and there's no denying there's an art to adding color while bringing out the wood's very own natural beauty.

Then, once the chairs have been upholstered and the last quality check passed, each set is carefully packaged, ready to become your dining room's new centerpiece. **C**

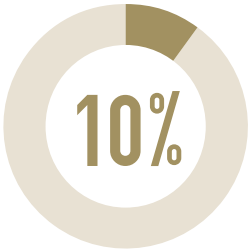
COLORS GLASS

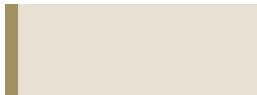

The art of the meal

Restricting a palette to cream and white, along with the soft tones found in the wood and a complementary watery grey for the seating, allows the furniture to shine while fostering a sense of serenity. Solid yet light in spirit, the casually set table suggests an easy hospitality. Bone-white china and shapely glass goblets keep it simple. Angular glass-and-wrought-iron candle holders—which echo the metal accents in the table—add a modern, sculptural touch. >

Big ferns in generous terracotta pots catch any gentle breeze, while a pretty pink orchid adds a touch of the exotic.

A covered porch, accessible by classic French doors, offers privacy and intimacy. With its refined lines and historically distressed finishes, Canadel's Champlain collection—inspired by early-colonial draft techniques—evokes a less frenetic time. Also, a historically round table signifies that all who sit around it are equals. The table's substantial pedestal base adds to a feeling of permanence and grace. BOUNTY HUNTING

Savoring the best of the Okanagan,
Canada’s fruit basket.

It starts in July, just as the sun is kissing Kelowna’s verdant fields and Lake Okanagan is at its bluest. With brown baskets in hand and fingers stained crimson red, people come from across British Columbia and beyond to pick Okanagan Valley’s cherries—tasting sweet and sour simultaneously, with pits so firm and juice so delicious, perhaps more berries are consumed than dropped into the baskets.

Picking seasons continue from there in this bright, fruitful corner of Canada: apricots in late July, peaches at the start of August, apples, pears, prunes, and plums through the beginning of fall. Then, just as the lake begins to cool and the blazing sun drops several moments earlier each day, the great Okanagan grape harvest begins. Skilled growers scramble to the fields to pick, moving swiftly and deliberately from one fruitful row to the next, clipping and hauling and crushing and concocting. This valley is the fruit

basket of Canada, and wine-making is the Okanagan’s crowning glory.

Situated mid-way between Calgary and Vancouver, and a road-trip-worthy drive from Washington State, Idaho, and Montana, the Okanagan Valley has long been a producer of goods to savor. Settlement began here more than 6,000 years ago by the Sylix and Okanagan people, who recognized its dry, sun-filled climate and rich volcanic soils as a special place for food gathering. Oblate missionaries arrived from Europe in the mid-1800s to spread the message of Christianity, but in their rucksacks came another kind of religion: grape vines.

Today, along the terraced lands of the 70-mile-long Okanagan Lake—its blueness brilliant in contrast to the emerald of the vineyards and orchards—lie fields of a dozen varietals. And it’s no wonder. The Okanagan Valley is drenched in

an average of 2,000 hours of sunshine annually and a pleasant 80 degrees Fahrenheit in summer. With more than 200 wineries in the region—30 alone in Kelowna—this Instagram-worthy place is now known as Canada’s Napa.

Oh, how the wine is fine in Kelowna. Produced steps from the city’s back door, vino is made with care and love by an eclectic group of vintners. With its Syrahs, Pinot Gris, and Orchard Block Gewurztraminers, Quails’ Gate Winery is a lush, relaxing, magnificent place. Tantalus Vineyards on Lake Okanagan’s eastern slopes—with its vast views and spare, spectacular architecture—maintains a strict non-interventionist approach and is the oldest continuously producing vineyard in all of British Columbia. Nearby CedarCreek has twice been recognized as “Canada’s Winery of the Year.” Pioneer Ranch’s Sperling Vineyards is the continued legacy of the Casorso family, among the first

to bring vines to the Okanagan from the old country. Mission Hill Family Estate is different yet again. Its art, opulence, and grand mission-like architecture inspired the venerable *New York Times* to label it “the Versailles of the Valley.”

Yet it's Kelowna's Summerhill Pyramid Winery that's the most eclectic of all, with its 100-percent certified organic and biodynamic wines aged in a four-storey-tall pyramid built according to the ratios of sacred geometry—indeed, the pyramid is a replica, on a 1:16 scale, of the Great Pyramid of Egypt.

“The knowingness of eternity awaits us in this sacred chamber,” explains Summerhill proprietor Stephen Cipes. “The word *py-ra-mid* means ‘fire in the middle.’ We all have this fire in the middle. It is our hearts, our souls. We are mostly liquid and we are affected just like the wine is affected. The effect is clarification. If a wine has a flaw in it, the flaw is accentuated. If the wine has good qualities, they are enhanced.”

Wine isn't the only yield of this land of dry air and bright skies and rich soil. The Okanagan Valley produces so many more scents and tastes. Vintners are known to keep beehives

on their estates, producing some of the region's sweetest syrup—and yes, even wines made with honey. Juices, jams, chutneys, and hot sauces are concocted in homey local kitchens, then sold at fruit and vegetable stands and in the country farmers' markets. The Okanagan Lavender & Herb Farm is a very special place—you'll want to curl up and go to sleep in one of its soft, fragrant, lavender-colored fields.

And finally, let's not forget Kelowna's farm-to-table restaurants, for they're known for coaxing the best tastes out of Okanagan's bounty. Among them: RauDZ Regional Table, where menus reflect organic, sustainable, and naturally raised ingredients. Tables

at the wineries—including Summerhill's Sunset Organic Bistro, CedarCreek's Vineyard Terrace, and Quails' Gate's Old Vines Restaurant—source their goodness right out of the surrounding fields and pastures. Chef Mark Filatow of the Waterfront Restaurant and Wine Bar picks his fruits and vegetables from his own backyard. And Sunshine Farm, with its rolling gardens, meadows, and ponds, lays out tables Tuscan-style in its fields, producing Napoleon pizzas from its outdoor, wood-fired oven.

Tastes are to be savored; good times are to be had. It's a bountiful region, British Columbia's Okanagan. No wonder they call it *Canada's fruit basket*.

To the uninitiated in these casual times, learning the proper way to set a table may seem like a daunting task. In fact it's fairly easy—and once mastered will become second nature. What a proper table setting does, essentially, is lay out the items in the order they will be used. The result is the smooth progression of the meal, with everything served, reached, and eaten in the most logical manner—making both hosts and guests comfortable.

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HOST'S HALF-DOZEN

SETTING A PROPER TABLE IS AS EASY AS ONE-TWO-THREE-FOUR-FIVE-SIX:

1. If desired, a napkin may be placed on the bread plate
2. If both are required, dessert spoon and fork are placed in opposition
3. If you have limited space, ask guests if they prefer red or white wine
4. Silverware is placed according to when it will be used, from the outside in
5. For a formal dinner, the plate for each course is brought directly to the table and laid on top of the service plate
6. Make sure that all knife edges are facing the plate, with soup spoon outside

MEXICAN LAYER DIP

YIELD: 4-6 SERVINGS

FOR THE REFRIED BEANS

- 1 medium-sized yellow onion, diced
- 1 tablespoon of olive oil
- 2 large cloves of garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon of ground cumin
- ½ tablespoon of chili powder
- 1 can (19 oz.) of black beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 tablespoon of chopped pickled jalapeño
- 1 teaspoon of salt

FOR THE LAYERS

- ¾ cup of sour cream
- 1 Roma tomato, chopped
- 2 scallions, sliced on the bias
- 1 avocado, roughly mashed or sliced
- ¾ cup of seeded cucumber, diced
- ½ cup of grated sharp orange cheddar cheese
- Sea salt, for seasoning
- Hot sauce (optional)
- Fresh cilantro for garnishing
- Lime juice

Sweat the onion in oil over medium-low heat until soft and translucent (not brown), about 10 minutes.

Add the garlic, cumin, and chili powder and stir, cooking until fragrant. Add the black beans, pickled jalapeño, and salt. Continue to stir until the liquid evaporates, about 1 minute.

Using a potato masher, mash the beans until they are roughly broken down. Taste and add more salt if necessary.

Spread the refried beans on a medium-sized platter and top with a generous layer of sour cream. Sprinkle with the tomato, scallions, avocado, cucumber, and cheese. Top with additional sour cream, salt, hot sauce, lime juice, and fresh cilantro.

Serve with a bowl of tortilla chips.

ROASTED SAUSAGE WITH GRAPES

YIELD: 4 SERVINGS

2 tablespoons of olive oil
4 to 6 Toulouse sausages
5 to 6 cups (2 pounds)
red or green seedless grapes,
stems removed

FOR THE GARNISH

3 tablespoons of mayonnaise
1 tablespoon of Dijon mustard
1 tablespoon of honey
4 fresh apricots, pitted and quartered
or 8 dried apricots, finely chopped
1 cup arugula
¼ cup of grated Parmigiano-Reggiano
or cheddar cheese
Olive oil
Salt and pepper

With the rack in the highest position, preheat the oven's broiler.

Lightly oil sausages and grapes on a baking sheet. Broil for 10 to 12 minutes or until the sausages are cooked through and the grapes are soft. Cut the sausages into slices.

FOR THE GARNISH

In a bowl, combine the mayonnaise, mustard, and honey. Set aside.

On four plates, divide the sausages and the grapes. Serve with mustard-honey sauce and garnish with the apricots, arugula, and cheese. Drizzle a little olive oil. Season with salt and pepper.

CHOCOLATE CAKE IN A CUP

YIELD: 1 SERVING

6 tablespoons of milk
1 tablespoon of canola oil
2 tablespoons of semisweet dark chocolate chips
1 tablespoon of unsweetened cocoa powder
5 tablespoons of unbleached all-purpose flour
1 tablespoon of sugar
¼ teaspoon of baking soda
1 teaspoon of vanilla extract

In a one cup-capacity mug or a Mason jar, combine the milk, canola oil, and chocolate chips. Add the cocoa powder, flour, sugar, baking soda, and vanilla.

Blend well with a fork, until the batter no longer has lumps.

Cook the cake in the microwave for 90 seconds. Let cool for 5 minutes to allow the cake to finish cooking.

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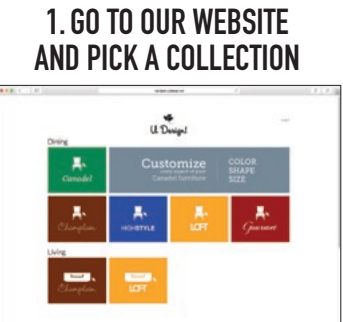
